

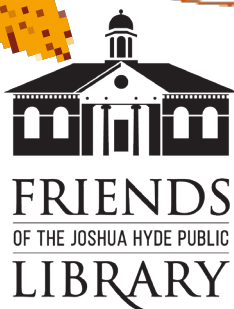

We just finished up our best-attended Summer Reading Program ever with 870 participants, including 420 adults. Our regular programming is going strong including our various book groups, movie programs and children's programs. We also had one of our best-attended Stewing Over Mysteries events ever this year featuring fan favorite Hank Phillipi Ryan.

We held a Holiday Food Drive, many author hours and tech help events, our ever-popular library mini-golf, and started the Pages & Packs Pantry in conjunction with Tantasqua High School. We hosted family game nights, held cooking demonstrations, and taught people how to start a bee hive. We also added some new museums to our Museum Pass collection, so make sure to stop in, grab a pass and have a fun excursion with friends and family on us! And there was so much more that happened at the library this year, I don't have the space to mention it all. If you enjoyed any of these programs, remember, none would have happened if it weren't for the Friends. The money raised through our membership drive, book sales and donations is what funds all the great programs that happen at the library.

We also gained a new children's librarian, Meredith Fournier, but said farewell to a library staple, Cheryl Zelazo, with her retirement after a few decades of being a fixture at Joshua Hyde. Hopefully you were able to say goodbye to her at her retirement celebration.

Come join the **WORLD BUILDING BOOK CLUB** for vibrant discussions of wide-ranging science fiction, fantasy and speculative fiction selections by enthusiasts of these genres. We explore what it means to be human, often from unexpected and sometimes non-human perspectives. We step outside the known and into future worlds, distant worlds, magical worlds or otherwise fantastical worlds in order to look back and understand ourselves and our world differently. Or just have a rollicking good time. Or a perplexing experience. Expect an energetic, respectful discussion with lot of opinions of the book, of the author's style, and of our experiences of reading it. And we usually end up eagerly sharing other favorite books with one another. We welcome everyone from world-building enthusiasts to the world-building curious and skeptical. We meet year-round, typically on the fourth Tuesday of the month at 6:30p with exceptions around holidays when it's likely to be the third Tuesday."

Each month is a delightful chance to explore a book you might not have read otherwise. And the group enjoys every moment of discussion and the perfectly themed refreshments and ambience table that reflects the current book.

Our newest addition to the book discussion is the **WORLD BUILDING BOOK CLUB** which focuses on science fiction, fantasy and speculative fiction. It already has a strong and loyal following and meets on the fourth Tuesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. in the Meeting Room.

Everyone is welcome to join in one or all of our diverse book discussion groups. Hope to see you soon!

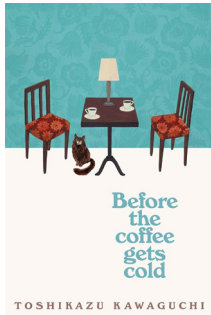

Have a wonderful start to the school year, and we'll see you again soon!

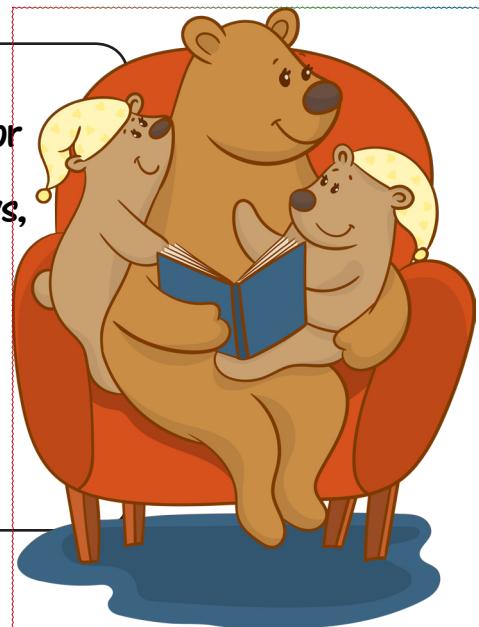
